As we begin each new year it is to be expected that Christmas is still on our minds, after all the first five days of January are the last five days of Christmas. Thus we enter each new year celebrating the birth of Christ, with Christmas decorations still up and perhaps some unwrapped gifts still under the tree. One of the central decorations in many homes is the Nativity scene depicting the various visitors Mary, Joseph, and baby Jesus received.

Many of us are used to seeing the Magi in our Nativity scenes, right alongside the shepherds and their sheep. However by their inclusion we forget that the Magi and Shepherds visited the baby Jesus at different times. Matthew's Gospel puts the visitation of the Magi after Jesus' birth, most likely months, or maybe even a year later. It is for this reason that the church celebrates the visitation of the Magi on January 6th, Epiphany, after the 12 days of Christmas have passed.

The Magi were wise men who came from the east looking for the newborn King of the Jews. They followed a star that led them to Judea and eventually to Bethlehem. The Magi knew of this prophesied birth and upon seeing the star, the sign of this king's birth, they sought him out.

In Advent and Christmas we remember that Jesus is Emmanuel, God with us. We recall that the Word became flesh and dwelt among us. We celebrate that God came to us in the baby Jesus, not just to show us a better way to live, but to give us life, life abundant, life eternal. This celebration is for me the most beautiful part of our faith. But after Christmas comes Epiphany and the story of the Magi. The Magi who saw the star and followed, seeking out the newborn king. Epiphany is an invitation to look for the signs of God's presence in our world. Epiphany is an invitation to seek out God in our midst.

As we begin this new year we are aware of what lies before us; a continuing pandemic, but one with a vaccine, and thus an end in sight. Before us lie the ever present challenges of racism, climate change, poverty, hunger, homelessness, and so much more. Before us lie the everyday joys and challenges of life; family, friends, school, work, and much more. Before us lies the lifelong pilgrimage of faith; where we seek to be open to the transform ing power of the Holy Spirit, that we might be formed in the image of Christ and together be the body of Christ in the world. In all that lies before us may we follow the example of the Magi, seeking God wherever the signs may point; be they grand or mundane, expected or unexpected.

Friends God is in our midst, let us seek after God with faith, reverence, joy, and most of all love.

We welcome back Charlotte Pavlik. She has participated as a CAP instructor in a variety of activities. Charlotte has a passion for creative arts, and is always excited to share her passion for creating something new, as well as to give fellow artists a sense of confidence in their own abilities.

On January 8th, 2020 Charlotte worked with a CAP group and introduced weather weaving. This art project would be done on a peg loom and would be a daily journal of the temperatures for each day of the year. This class got us started, and with a few minutes each day we would create a piece of art that will be a colorful calendar of 2020. Each temperature block, 30°-39° for example, will had a color of yarn assigned to it, we then would weave that color for that day. This project would take atleast 12 different colors. It would be an enjoyable way to watch the weather.

On January 13th,2021 Charlotte will teach us how to complete the project. Please bring you loom, no matter what stage/ month you are in, and your yarn.

The Mission committee recommended, and the Session agreed that the remaining funds in the grant be given to the Buffalo Art Guild, our partner in this grant. This money will be used by the Buffalo Art Guild to continue to offer art opportunities for seniors in our area.

Session Summary

Highlights of the November 17 stated meeting

Session focuses on the 2021 church budget

Elders spent much of the November Session meeting discussing next year's church budget. Although the pandemic has allowed the church to decrease spending in a few minor ways, there is still a need to maintain, and increase current income levels. Most of the church's expenses are in compensating personnel and in maintaining our building and grounds. Those expenditures have not decreased.

Among the Session's current goals are increased mission spending and providing raises for church employees. The church also faces a one-time expense covering a \$2,500 deductible for replacement of the hail-damaged church roof. Achieving these goals will require income increases, pledged giving, from church members and friends.

The budget was the subject of a Zoom conversation Sunday, November 22. Church members will have an opportunity to comment on the budget at a special congregational meeting on Sunday, December 13, at 10:30 am on Zoom. In the coming days, you will receive a copy of the budget to review before the meeting.

Hopefully you've already returned your 2021 pledge. But if you have not yet done so, please return it as soon as possible. Pledge information is necessary for the Session to approve a responsible budget for 2021.
